On Monday, September 30, 2024, BCDI will present a talk about optimizing patient outcomes beyond treatment in the bleeding disorders community. MOLINE OUTREACH EVENT

The Bleeding & Clotting Disorders Institute consistently delivers the highest standard of care and education to individuals with bleeding disorders, blood clotting, and other blood related disorders. Alongside Bleeding Disorders of the Heartland and the Bleeding Disorders Alliance Illinois, BCDI is hosting a **FREE** educational dinner event in Moline, Illinois on Monday, September 30, 2024 at River House (1510 River Dr, Moline IL 61265) from 6:00 p.m. – 7:30 p.m.

BCDI Associate Medical/Research Director Dr. Jonathan Roberts will be the keynote speaker during the event, leading a presentation entitled "Optimizing Outcomes Beyond Treatment: The Value of Comprehensive Care for Individuals with Bleeding Disorders." In this interactive presentation, Dr. Roberts will explain the importance of expert care at comprehensive care clinics, which have a long-term track record of providing timely diagnosis, treatment plans and optimal outcomes for persons with bleeding disorders.

Living with a bleeding disorder requires lifestyle changes that not only affect the individual with the diagnosis, but their loved ones as well. That' why Hemophilia Treatment Centers, like BCDI, utilize a comprehensive care model. PDSA ITP CONFERENCE 2024

BCDI's team of esteemed experts represented the bleeding and clotting disorders community at the Platelet Disorder Support Association's 24th Annual ITP Conference in San Antonio, Texas on July 26 – 28. This event continues to be a vital platform for individuals and families impacted by ITP (immune thrombocytopenic purpura), which is a rare bleeding disorder characterized by a low amount of platelets in the blood.

BCDI Chief Executive Officer and Chief Medical Officer Dr. Michael Tarantino serves on the PDSA Board of Medical Advisors and played a key role in the success of PDSA's 2024 ITP Conference. Dr. Tarantino led a question-and-answer session about ITP in Adults and the Evolution of ITP treatment and guidelines, as he shared the best practices when it comes to the use of steroids for individuals with an ITP diagnosis. Dr. Tarantino also led a keynote dinner program entitled "Taking Charge of Your ITP Journey Together With Your Doctor," which placed an emphasis on the important conversations that patients need to have with their hematologist and how to impower patients to become their own advocate.





BCDI Chief Operating Officer and Chief Financial Officer Becky Burns led a presentation entitled "Financial Toxicity: Navigating Insurance with a Rare Disease." In this interactive session, Burns provided key information to ITP patients and families about important insurance terms to know, highlighted challenges that prior authorizations and coverage denials pose, and helped define consequences of high patient cost-share, copay assistance and coinsurance.

PDSA's ITP Conference also provided a teen education track, where BCDI Advanced Practice Provider Supervisor Kristin Ansteatt and BCDI Nurse Coordinator Kelsey Kuhel joined Dr. Tarantino in leading the teen sessions. Each year, the BCDI team creates a project that allows teens to share about their ITP diagnosis and discuss their journey with others. This year, a mascot and tagline were created for the teens group based off drawings about their experiences with ITP. BCDI graphic designer Sophie Tarantino then re-created the drawings to be printed out as stickers, with a plan to make sticker packs out of the projects completed at the last three years of the PDSA ITP Conference.

With over 250 guests in attendance at PDSA's 2024 ITP Conference, the BCDI team made a large impact in sharing vital education to individuals with an ITP diagnosis. We invite you to join us during the month of September for ITP Awareness Month, where BCDI will help spread crucial information about living with ITP, how to minimize some of the most common challenges ITP presents and to help improve your overall quality of life.

SIMON FRANCIS

Every quarter, BCDI aims to highlight members of the bleeding and clotting disorders community, including patients, families, BCDI staff members and community partners.


Simon Francis was born June 29, 2018, and within his first week of life was diagnosed with Hemophilia A. The journey through Simon's diagnosis and first year of life was a rollercoaster of emotions for parents Scott Francis and Rebecca Francis.

"Imagine the stereotypical new parents wide eyed and trying to process an already hectic time of birth and fatigue. Now add an unknown and medically complex diagnosis of your son having Hemophilia A." Rebecca Francis said. "Being told that your newborn baby will be transported via a very expensive and very special ambulance that requires special staff and very small equipment."

Shortly after Simon's diagnosis, the Francis family met BCDI hematologist Dr. Jonathan Roberts during a local hospital rotation. To this day, Simon is still a patient of Dr. Roberts.

"Dr. Roberts continues to set the bar for excellent patient care," Rebecca said. "When we first met Dr. Roberts, he spoke about how there is a patient care staff meeting every Tuesday, and Simon was the center of their attention. He also shared stories from his childhood (Dr. Roberts has severe Hemophilia A) and continued to reinforce the narrative that Hemophilia was not to be feared."

Before Simon's first birthday, the Francis family had several scares where emergency medical attention was required. In separate incidents, Dr. Roberts provided on-call support, BCDI registered nurse Missy Quin assisted with a soft tissue bleed and BCDI COO/CFO Becky Burns helped with complex barriers to insurance coverage on more than one occasion.



The Francis family is also involved in advocacy and raising awareness for individuals with bleeding disorders. Rebecca is a member of the Patient Advisory Board at BCDI, which is a patient-led group which provides guidance and feedback on how the care team at BCDI can continue to meet the best standards of comprehensive and compassionate healthcare. The Patient Advisory Board provides BCDI patients an opportunity to come together and share ideas that may benefit the bleeding disorders community.

"As a mother of a patient, I am committed to this cause and the clinic," Rebecca added. "It is very important to me as a member of the Patient Advisory Board to further the success of the clinic for the betterment of their patients from all ages and walks of life. Dr. Tarantino has built up an excellent team who continues to research, advocate and move BCDI into the forefront of this field."

BEACON TIPS

PHYSICAL THERAPY AT BCDI

BCDI is committed to providing excellent patient care. Comprehensive Care Clinics are one of the many ways we work to achieve this goal. Use of a multidisciplinary team helps us deliver care that focuses on different aspects of the individual to provide the best patient-centered experience. Physical Therapy is an important component of our Comprehensive Team.

Physical therapists provide interventions that target improving areas such as range of motion, flexibility, balance and strength. An advancement in these areas can help improve pain levels including chronic pain, mobility during daily tasks and encourage safe participation.

Pain whether short lived, chronic, or injury provoked can cause a disruption in our daily routine. Physical therapists work with you to decrease pain levels through interventions such as strengthening, stretching, guided progression of exercises, manual hands-on techniques and more.

When pain, a recent bleed or other factors decrease participation, physical therapists will work with you to help modify activities allowing return to full performance. At times, this may require assistive devices such as canes/walkers/crutches. Your physical therapist can help you learn how to navigate the use of these devices and adjust them to your correct height. Other modifications may include changing an office desk set up to prevent neck pain or providing training in lifting techniques to decrease strain on your back. We may discuss proper fitting gear or footwear when performing sports, recreation or prolonged walking. For our younger population, we work to make sure they are hitting their target developmental milestones needed for play and keeping up with their friends.

Safety with activities is another goal that physical therapists aim to work on. We work with patients and the comprehensive care team to help assist with choosing safe exercise/sporting options. Other concerns for safety include falling and loss of balance. Physical therapists can offer ideas on modifications to home environment, exercises for strengthening and exercises to improve balance such as our body's awareness of where we are in space.

We know that many bleeding and clotting disorders affect multiple aspects of one's life and well-being. During comprehensive care visits we educate on joint health, activity choices, and continue to monitor range of motion, strength, gait, and balance. We are also available to provide education on assistive devices when recovering from bleeds or progression back to activity and range of motion after bleeds/injuries.

Our physical therapist at BCDI, Rachel, wants to work with YOU to help restore function and return to the activities YOU want and love to do! If you have any questions, please contact your care team at BCDI.

WAYS WE CAN ASSIST YOU

- Pain: joint pain, muscle pain, chronic pain
- Range of motion, flexibility
- Mobility: getting in and out of bed, in/out of cars, etc





- Activity modification: helping to make activities safe and increase participation
- Assist with balance
- Assistive device usage and options
- Rehabilitation after injuries



- Developmental Milestones age appropriate skills
- Postures/positions: lifting techniques, positions for desk work
- Education such as: importance of properly fitting gear/shoe wear and physical activity for overall wellness
