Thanks to the generosity of our incredible community, BCDI Trivia Night 2025 fundraising efforts raised a record-high with over \$150,000 to further the mission of BCDI- making a positive impact on the lives of thousands of BCDI patients across the Midwest. BCDI has also made significant progress in our research initiatives, collaborating with leading institutions to explore innovative treatments and therapies. The BCDI research department has 19 active studies ongoing, bringing us closer to breakthroughs that may transform long-term patient care.

BCDI ADVOCACY UPDATE

BCDI is committed to leading the charge for the bleeding and clotting disorders community and ensuring that all patients receive high quality treatment and have access to vital medications. In March 2025, the BCDI advocacy team made two trips to help raise awareness about crucial topics that affect our community.

On Thursday, March 6, 2025, BCDI Chief Operating Officer **Becky Burns**, Director of Foundation & Education **Jamie Cunningham**, and Director of Outreach & Communications **Matt McClain** went to Washington D.C. to speak with members of Congress on Capitol Hill.

The BCDI team joined with constituents of the Illinois bleeding disorders community to educate members of the House of Representatives and the Senate about various access to care issues and to raise awareness about the importance of Hemophilia Treatment Centers, like BCDI. We'd like to thank the offices of **Representative Darin LaHood, Representative Mary Miller, Senator Dick Durbin, Representative Eric Sorensen, Representative Robin Kelly and Representative Jan Schakowsky for taking the time to meet with us!**







BCDI is not only aware of national issues affecting our community, but is focused on Illinois legislation throughout the state. On March 20, 2025, Burns and McClain led a team of Illinois advocates to the Illinois capitol in Springfield, which included BCDI patient advisory board member Nicole Spangler. In total, BCDI met with five congressional offices to discuss changes within the Illinois medical community and to raise awareness about issues that are directly affecting individuals with bleeding, blood clotting or other blood disorders. We'd like to thank **Senator Dave Koehler, Representative Ryan Spain, Senator Li Arellano, Jr, Representative Bill Hauter and the office of Senator Sally Turner** for the opportunity to speak with them!

BEACON SUPPORT

PREPARING FOR EMERGENCIES

If you or a loved one have a bleeding, blood clotting or other blood disorder, it's vital to be prepared for unexpected situations that may disrupt your comfort zone or everyday routine. Right here in Illinois, **April through June is considered severe weather season** with the threat of tornadoes or thunderstorms at the forefront. Natural disasters can happen with little-to-no notice, so it is crucial to be ready! With that being said:

Do you have your disaster preparation kit ready for you and your family?

Families with rare medical conditions should be prepared for emergencies and include both basic needs and medical needs in their planning. BCDI's staff is on call 24 hours a day, seven days a week, for 365 days of the year in case you are in need, and the BCDI pharmacy has protocols in place to help with emergencies especially if your supply or access to your medication is effected.



WHAT CAN YOU DO?

It is vitally important that you always have enough of the medications and supplies you need on hand. Factor needs to be kept at specific temperatures, so be sure to keep your medications cold with coolers and ice packs should your power go out or you need to travel during a crisis. It may be beneficial to keep multiple ice packs in your freezer in case of a quick need. Take your entire factor supply and related supplies with you!

Wear your medical alert jewelry. All BCDI patients have the opportunity to receive a piece of jewelry with their medical diagnosis clearly stated so that if you were to get in a medical emergency, first responders and healthcare workers would know how to help treat you. BCDI provides necklaces or bracelets to patients free of charge, so please call us if you are in need.

Create an emergency kit to have on hand at home for when you need to make a split-second decision if you need to leave. This can include, but is not limited to:

- a small first aid kit
- food & water
- phone charger
- portable radio
- flashlight
- extra batteries
- personal toiletries
- copies of important documents
- a complete change of clothes

Keep important phone numbers (insurance, family members, HTC, local doctors) with your kit.

These small steps can make a HUGE difference in an emergency, so be sure to plan ahead! Preparedness may feel like a lot of work, but it can make a world of difference in a stressful situation.



BEACON SPOTLIGHT

THE TRUPIANO & STEVENSON FAMILY

The Trupiano and Stevenson family have lived with hemophilia for generations, navigating its challenges with resilience and support. Mike Stevenson's journey began with a childhood filled with painful treatments, many of which carried severe risks. At the age of 36, Mike faced a life-threatening battle with hepatitis D, ultimately requiring a liver transplant. BCDI CEO/CMO Dr. Michael Tarantino played a pivotal role in saving his life by connecting him with a willing transplant center.

"Dr. T saved my life and without him, I wouldn't be here," Mike Stevenson said.

Mike's sister, Katie Trupiano, discovered she was a carrier of hemophilia during her first pregnancy. Katie and her husband, Joe Trupiano, now have two sons- Joey and Willborn with severe hemophilia A. Unlike past generations, Joey and Will have benefited from advancements in hemophilia treatment through centers like BCDI, allowing them to lead normal lives. BCDI has been instrumental in their journey, providing medical care, education, and advocacy. From ensuring school accommodations, providing comprehensive care, to helping them manage their medication as they transition into adulthood, BCDI's approach has provided confidence and independence.





"I feel like BCDI is family to us," Katie Trupiano said. "They're such an integral part of our lives, as a resource, as a support system, just the advocacy for patients in general, I cannot recommend this center enough. They're world class."

The Trupiano and Stevenson family's story is a testament to the progress in hemophilia treatment, made possible through medical advancements and the unwavering support of BCDI. Their journey highlights not only the struggles they've faced but also the strength, hope, and gratitude that define their experience.

"I'm so lucky and I am so privileged to have care from BCDI, that as many people as possible with hemophilia should be receiving this quality of care," Joey Trupiano said. "If there's anyone out there that isn't receiving this quality of care, that's another reason that we should be supporting organizations like the BCDI because the more that they can expand and provide these services to people who are in need of them, the more that you we're going to live in a world where hemophilia is sort of an afterthought, instead of a life affecting thing."

BCDI BLOOD DROP SOCIETY


