BEACON SPOTLIGHT

LOLA ORTIZ

Every quarter, BCDI aims to highlight members of the bleeding and clotting disorders community, including patients, families, BCDI staff members and community partners. BCDI patient Dolores "Lola" Ortiz living with Immune Thrombocytopenic Purpura (ITP). In a recent interview with our BCDI team, Dolores explains her experiences living with a bleeding disorder and how BCDI has helped impower her to live a "normal" life.

Question: When did you first become aware that you had a bleeding disorder?

Answer: About ten years ago, I was babysitting my nephew in Washington and getting ready to drive him to school. While I was stopped at a red light, a school bus hit my car. The bus driver gave me a business card and told me to take it to the school principal's office. When I got home, I told my husband what had happened. We went to a car shop together, and while he was getting an estimate, I received a phone call from a nurse. She told me that the doctor's office had just received my lab results, and my platelet levels were dangerously low. She said I needed to go to the ER immediately—I could bleed to death. I was 48 years old at the time, and neither my husband nor I understood the urgency, especially since I didn't feel sick at all. At the ER, they told me I needed an infusion and had to be admitted to the hospital overnight. The ER doctor referred me to a Peoria-area healthcare company, where I was eventually diagnosed with ITP (Immune Thrombocytopenic Purpura). I started seeing doctors there, but over time, I felt that they weren't truly interested in my care. I didn't feel seen or valued.





Q: What was your first experience with BCDI and how did you learn about our services?

A: Back then, I was working at a doctor's clinic and a nurse practitioner I trusted recommended I see Dr. Tarantino at BCDI. From the moment I walked into BCDI, I felt welcome. The front desk lady who checked me in talked about her two pet goats and instantly made me feel at home. When I met Dr. T, my anxiety disappeared. He was warm, down-to-earth, and took the time to clearly explain my ITP diagnosis to my husband and me. I saw kindness, compassion, and genuine care in his eyes. I wasn't just another patient- I mattered. BCDI has truly been a lifesaver.

Q: How has BCDI played a role in living a manageable life with ITP?

A: Everyone at BCDI is incredibly supportive and helpful, no matter what life throws my way. For example, I lost my insurance a few months ago, and Becky, Marsha, Missy, and other nurses went above and beyond to help me get my medication and ease my worries. The pharmacy staff has also been amazing- always helpful and encouraging. When I go to BCDI for my weekly infusions, it feels like home. The front desk team is always friendly, and waiting for my nurse feels like a peaceful break in my day.

Q: If someone is newly diagnosed with a bleeding or blood clotting disorder, would you recommend them to seek care at BCDI for their treatment?

A: My family is deeply grateful to BCDI and Dr. Tarantino for helping me stay alive and live a normal life. I wholeheartedly recommend BCDI to anyone with a bleeding disorder. They will never treat you differently because of your nationality, language, or culture. Dr. Tarantino and his team are truly the best thing that happened to me after my diagnosis with chronic ITP.

Hemophilia Alliance Hill Days

October 7, 2025

BCDI staff, patients and members of the bleeding disorders community traveled to Washington D.C. to visit Capitol Hill as part of the Hemophilia Alliance's Hill Days event. The BCDI team of Becky Burns, Wendy Ferrill, Chris Monk, Sophia Tarantino, Matt McClain and BCDI patient and advocate **Jim Wilson** spoke with members of Congress about the role Hemophilia Treatment Center's play for their patients and the importance of the HTC care model, about several access to care issues throughout the community, and raising awareness about the integral part the 340B program plays in providing high-quality care that is offered at HTC's. This helps to lower overall healthcare costs and most importantly, leads to optimal outcomes for patients with a bleeding disorder. We would like to thank the offices of Rep. Darin LaHood, Rep. Eric Sorensen, Rep. Jan Schakowsky, Rep. Mary Miller, Rep. Robin Kelly, and Senator Tammy Duckworth for taking time out of his busy schedule to personally meet with us!

Dr. Tarantino also presented findings from a BCDI-led project, "Hemophilia Treatment Center Immune Thrombocytopenia Purpura (ITP) Survey – Results and Overview" during the Hemophilia Alliance Fall Members meeting while in Washington D.C. The survey revealed that many individuals living with ITP across the U.S. are receiving some degree of specialized care through hemophilia treatment centers. These findings reinforce Dr. Tarantino's vision of building a national network of treatment centers for ITP, modeled after BCDI's own comprehensive care clinics.



Moline Educational Dinner October 20, 2025

Alongside our community and event partners at Bleeding Disorders of the Heartland, BCDI presented a free educational dinner in Moline on Monday, October 20 at Fifth Avenue Syndicate. BCDI BLOOD DROP SOCIETY


